



Applications for 2018 Audubon Summer Camp Scholarships Now Being Accepted

Black River Audubon Society is offering two 2018 Hog Island scholarships to adults that cover tuition, room, board, and travel expenses. Our goal is that the recipients will follow the examples of those who have returned from Hog Island as ambassadors for conservation and education.

For the past three decades, Black River Audubon Society has awarded educators, naturalists, and environmental leaders the opportunity to acquire knowledge and skills to educate others about bird conservation and the environment at the Audubon Hog Island summer camps.

Campers spend one week on the island off the coast of Maine, learning from accomplished naturalists, birders and educators. Past scholarship winners have loved the camp's natural surroundings and rustic 19th-century buildings. Excellent meals are served in a communal dining room.

Camp/class reservations have been made for two BRAS Hog Island scholarship winners. They include *Field Ornithology*, which will run from June 18th to 23rd and *Sharing Nature: An Educator's Week*, July 15th to 20th.
